WRIT 2311 Writing in the Digital Age Analyzing a Community Organization's Online Presence

Goals

You will rhetorically analyze a community organization's online presence across platforms in order to develop a complex understanding of how they represent their work.

This project serves to make you critically aware of how the modes each play a role in shaping the organization's online presence. It also provides a robust understanding of the rhetorical situation we are entering into by creating content for Austin Free-Net; by digging into their online content, you will learn more about the digital divide and digital inclusion and how different organizations address these issues.

Means

In class we have discussed the rhetorical situation as being comprised of an audience, purpose, context, genre, and medium. Your readings from Arola, Sheppard, and Ball's *Writer/Designer* use a similar heuristic (or method) for considering the rhetorical situation. In this assignment you will work backwards in order to consider that situation. In other words, you will begin by analyzing the modes of communication employed by the author—in this case that author is the community organization that you are assigned—in order to understand how he/she/they considered that situation.

Workflow

On Tues., Sept 19: You will be assigned a community organization whose online presence you will analyze.

Due on Tues., Sept. 26: Use the heuristics reproduced below to gather and code information that you will use in your analysis. You will turn in these heuristics via Box, and workshop them outside class on Sept. 26 in order to address your progress. Name your file as follows: LastnameHeuristics.docx.

Due on Thurs., Sept.28: Submit a draft of your rhetorical analysis. Again, you will use the instructions posted to the Canvas site to provide one another with feedback on your drafts. Additionally, I will provide feedback on your drafts, which you will receive in class on Tues., Oct 3. Name your file as follows: LastnameAnalysisDraft.docx.

Due by11:59 pm on Tues., Oct. 10: Complete and submit your final draft. Name your file as follows: LastnameAnalysisFinal.docx.

In starting your work, you should spend time dissecting the website for the organization that you are assigned. Read through materials on the site, and use the grid below to address how the site uses the following.
